The Akron Zoo is certified sensory inclusive by KultureCity. All staff are trained on sensory processing to raise awareness and inform them of all aspects of the sensory inclusion program.

Sensory bags are available to borrow (free of charge) for any guest who would like to use the bag. Each bag contains noise-cancelling headphones, fidget toys and sunglasses. There are also communication cards to anyone who is non-verbal who may need to communicate with staff.

Several areas of the zoo are designated as quite areas, which are areas where guests don't tend to linger and it normally doesn't get as loud. These areas are not silent areas though. They also have "headphone zones," which are areas that get loud, crowds tend to linger and/or noisy animals are nearby. As guests enter those zones, there is signage indicating that they might need to use the noise-cancelling headphones in those areas.

A Guest Comfort Station is available where guests can go for privacy to nurse, administer medicine or just need a few moments alone away from crowds. More details are available online.
