

K-3 Literacy Assessments: Examining Why, What, and How

- be able to determine the type of literacy assessment tool (benchmark screening, progress monitoring, diagnostic...) best suited to gather data on critical early literacy skills
- collaboratively examine different assessment tools to determine efficacy in measuring the critical early literacy skills
- reflect on the tools used by their own district to determine the efficacy of those tools in measuring the critical early literacy skills
